Students are encouraged to find information from libraries, archives, the Web, or even oral history interviews. After research is done, analyzed, interpreted, and conclusions drawn about the significance of the chosen topic, students are asked to present their findings in one of three ways:

Essay Papers: Word count should range from 1,200 – 2,500. Bibliographies or annotations should be included to acknowledge information sources, including any oral history interviews.

Performances: Skits based on Ethiopian history or present-day life as affected by the Battle of Adwa, or the performance of traditional dances, are encouraged. These should be limited to 15 minutes.

Presentations: Students are encouraged to make PowerPoint or video presentations. Information sources should be included. These too must be no longer than 15 minutes.

Final Competition: The top three entries in each category will be given the opportunity to compete on stage for the final scholarship awards at the Annual Adwa Celebration on March 3.

Judges: Judging will be done by a group of professional educators and historians with a scholarly and personal interest in Ethiopian history, heritage, society, and politics.

Entry Eligibility: Students in grades 9-12 and college freshman are eligible. Homeschooled youngsters are very much encouraged to compete as well.

Entry Deadline: Entries must be submitted by February 22, 2013.
