Zenawi's Tricks a "Small Bump in the Road"

Congressman Donald Payne has re-scheduled mark-up of H.R. 2003 for July 18, 2007, at 10:15 a.m. We thank Don Payne for his commitment to freedom, democracy and human rights in Ethiopia.

On June 26, 2007, (the initial scheduled date for mark-up of H.R. 2003), Zenawi tried to pull the usual "fast one" on Congress by threatening to take the Kality political prisoners hostage. He effectively blackmailed the members of the Committee by threatening to indefinitely jail the Kality prisoners should the bill be marked-up. At the time, Zenawi's regime had requested a 2-week postponement of the mark-up so that a negotiated release

of the Kality prisoners could be effected. The regime had calculated that it could derail the bill by removing it from the June 26 calendar.

Liar, Liar...

The Kality prisoners were supposed to have been released on or before July 9, 2007, the date set for their "sentencing" by Zenawi's Kangaroo Kourt. That date, as usual was continued to July 16. With the rescheduled mark-up date, it appears crystal clear that both Payne and the numerous co-sponsors of the bill are no longer willing to put up with Zenawi's "horsefeathers."

I am writing to ask you to co-sponsor H.R. 2003 ("Ethiopia Freedom and Accountability Act of 2007) and to help place it on the next mark-up calendar of the House Foreign Affairs Committee. I also respectfully ask that following committee consideration, you vote to recommend the bill as amended do pass.

As you may recall, on June 26, 2007, the scheduled mark-up action on H.R. 2003 was delayed because the ruling regime in Ethiopia, through its official representatives, communicated to the Committee that mark-up action on the bill on that date will adversely affect the release of the prisoners of conscience held in Kality prison.

I have learned that the Committee, in the face of such unprecedented challenge to its institutional integrity, nonetheless agreed to delay mark-up action for 2 weeks, which occurs this week.

As you know, H.R. 2003 (Ethiopia Freedom and Accountability Act of 2007) is not merely about the release of political prisoners in Kality prison. It is fundamentally about reclaiming, revitalizing and advancing human rights as a central pillar of American foreign policy.

To that end, H.R. 2003 aims to institute accountability and democratic reforms in Ethiopia, aid in the restoration of the democratic rights of the people, strengthen human rights and civic society organizations, increase the independence of the judiciary, assist in bringing to justice human rights abusers are brought to justice, ensure fraud free-elections, and removing press censorship, among many others. Simply stated, it is a bill that aims to institutionalize the rule of law in Ethiopia.

H.R. 2003 is presently co-sponsored by Chairman Lantos, and thirteen other members. I respectfully request your co-sponsorship because I take great pride in the fact that my representative from the great state of _____ stood up to defend freedom, democracy and human rights in ____ Ethiopia, where most of my relatives and friends still live. I also appreciate your help in expediting the mark-up of the bill by requesting that it be placed on the next calendar of the Committee.
